CITY OF RIVERSIDE RECOGNIZES ARCHITECTURE WEEK

Architects from WWCOT accept city proclamation on behalf of AIA Inland California Chapter

The City of Riverside issued the proclamation to recognize local architects' efforts to ensure the creation of safe and attractive structures for the Inland Empire. First recognized by President Reagan in 1982, National Architecture Week is a time for architects to educate citizens about effect that thoughtful design has on the built environment. This year, the American Institute of Architects' Inland California Chapter (AIAIC) celebrated Architecture Week at Victoria Gardens in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. with design activities for children and adults, demonstrations of computer modeling programs and displays from local university architecture programs.
